

Questions to help you think about today's teaching - to discuss in housegroups, or use at home:

Judgment and revelation (1 Samuel 3:1-4:1)

- 1. Think about the story from Eli's and then from Samuel's perspectives. What are the things that really speak to you or challenge you?
- 2. What does this story tell us about God?
- 3. How do you respond when you hear God speaking into your life directly, through the Bible, through someone else?

Relating to God the Father (Ephesians 1:3-14)

- 4. Work through the passage and identify all the things that God the Father has done for us. How do you respond to them?
- 5. How, in response to that, does Paul suggest we should be living our lives? What can get in the way of doing this?
- 6. How do you best relate to God as Father?
