## Questions to help you think about today's teaching - to discuss in housegroups, or use at home:

"Your kingdom come" (Luke 14:15-24 )

1. Jesus tells this parable in response to a statement made by someone. What was the heart behind this statement, and why does Jesus tell this story in response?
2. In the parable are several characters: the owner of the house, the servant, those who are invited first, the poor, crippled, blind and lame, and the final group who are invited. How much do you associate with each group? Which group do feel you would most WANT to associate with?
3. Who do you think the people who make excuses are in the story? Are there people like that today? Are we ever guilty of that kind of attitude?
4. If we are honest, are there people who we struggle with the idea of them being included in God's Kingdom and would find it easier if they weren't invited? Are there ways our actions might betray that attitude?
5. How can we, in our everyday lives, make room for people who might ordinarily feel excluded?
6. Why do you think Jesus uses the image of a banquet in the first place?
7. Who are you inviting to the banquet? What has their response been so far? And what are you going to do next?

## **St Editha's Book and Fairtrade Shop - Fairtrade Fortnight**

Every year the Fairtrade Foundation has a two-week celebration of all things fairtrade in order to promote the importance of choosing fairtrade items. This year Fairtrade Fortnight begins on Monday 26th February and runs until Sunday 11th March. The theme this year is "Come On In" – the idea being that fairtrade opens doors for producers but also that we can open the door ourselves and choose to buy fairtrade products. The alternative to fairtrade is exploitation and injustice – we can choose fairness and justice when we do our shopping.

At St Editha's shop we'll be celebrating Fairtrade Fortnight by inviting you to "Come on in" and try our goods. Each day we'll have samples of fairtrade foods for you to try. We will also have lots of information on the importance of fairtrade and what it means for the producers and we'll be collecting for Traidcraft Exchange's "Hidden Entrepreneur" campaign.
