Questions to help you think about today's teaching - to discuss in housegroups, or use at home:

The vital importance of the resurrection (1 Corinthians 15:12-20)

1. In Paul's day, just as in our day, there were people understandably struggling with the idea of people coming back to life. Why do you think he is so insistent on the actual, historical resurrection of Jesus?
2. What significance does the resurrection of Jesus have to you?
3. How would you discuss the resurrection with someone who didn't believe in it? How would you engage with them?

The Victory of Jesus (Revelation 5:1-10)

4. Jesus is recognised as the conquering sacrifice? What do you think about these images? Are they helpful, do you struggle with them?
5. How – from this passage – would you describe the significance of the death of Jesus?
6. What does it mean for you to be part of a “kingdom and priests to serve our God” and people who “will reign on the earth” (v10)?
