Food in the freezer

Night Shelter: we are doing quite well for volunteers, but could do with someone else to help transport the beds and bags please. This involves picking the beds and bags up from church on a Sunday morning, loading into a vehicle and taking to St Johns church and offloading them at St Johns. Discipleship - thinking a bit more

We're coming to the end of our series on discipleship so here are two books that are well worth reading.



The Radical Disciple by John Stott

talks about “wholehearted Christian living”. Here Stott calls on believers in Jesus to submit themselves to the authority of Jesus in all aspects of their lives focussing on eight different things that will mean:

- Not-conforming to the world around us
- Becoming more like Jesus
- Becoming mature Christians
- Caring for God’s creation
- Living simple lives
- Balancing different things we are called to be
- Depending on God
- Being prepared to die

In His Steps by Charles Sheldon

is a very different book. It’s a fictional story of a mysterious stranger who appears in town and pleads with people to care for the poor and the struggling in society. The stranger - in his first public appearance - speaks up during a church service and asks the question “What do you Christians mean by following the steps of Jesus?” and gives lots of examples where they could be doing so but don’t seem to be. Responding to his challenging questions, the church minister and five key people in the town commit themselves to live differently for one year - to live following the example and teaching of Jesus. It makes a tremendous impact on them, on the people around them, the places they work.

Please get hold of one (or both!), read and engage prayerfully with it.

And if you like the idea of being part of a “book club” where you could read a chapter of one of the books each week and then get together to discuss, please let Graham know.
